A Chaplain is also available as well as Yolanda and Joel from the Salvation Army.

My sincere thanks to Yolanda and Joel and the many volunteers who are providing food and support to the weary firefighters. Thank God for the Salvos!

Despite all this the Peter Allen Festival went ahead and was a great success for our community and local businesses. Despite the lack of power on Friday evening, Matt

and Josh did a great job in getting things rolling and again on behalf of Council, I offer my sincere congratulations to them and their committee for their determination to continue with this great event and my thanks to the many visitors who stayed to ensure the event's success and bring some joy to our shocked community.

I thank our loyal Council staff who again rallied to ensure that the best possible outcomes can be achieved for our community both on the fire fronts, at the Evacuation Centre and at the Festival during the weekend.

Our thoughts also go to Neville Smith and his family in Brisbane. That a volunteer firefighter should be injured while performing his duty is indeed tragic. We wish you well Neville and hope you will be back in our community soon.
