SAFETY OF STAFF PARAMOUNT ROADWORKS ONGOING THROUGHOUT THE SHIRE

While Council, like most other local governments, was considering the need to purchase or lease additional vehicles to allow road works and Parks & Gardens crews to continue normal operations, one of the workshop staff members had the brilliant idea of installing soft plastic barriers between the front and rear sections to enable 2 people to travel safely in the one vehicle.

This fantastic initiative has enabled Council to eliminate the need to hire additional vehicles and now that vehicles have been set up with this easy to install and remove plastic barrier, work crews are out and about doing their regular work, despite the COVID-19 segregation provisions.

Road works planned for the next 2-3 weeks include:

Capital Works

- Woodside Causeway replacement;
- Recommence Bruxner Way (Sunnyside Loop to New England Highway) widening and sight distance improvements;
- Plains Station Road widening and rehabilitation;
- Urbenville Road Unnamed Creek bridge replacement commencement (demolition works initially)
- Beaury Creek Road Boundary Creek bridge replacement commencement (demolition works initially);
- Mt Lindesay Road (Legume to Woodenbong) survey and ecologist works;
- Hootons road Emu Creek Bridge replacement commencement(demolition works initially)
- Tooloom Road Beaury Creek Bridge replacement commencement (demolition works initially)

Maintenance Grading

- Northern Vinegar Hill Road, Patterson Road, Rivertree Road;
- Eastern Upper Rocky River Road, Rocky River Road;
- Central & Western Mt MacKenzie Road, Gunyah Road, Scrub Road, Mill Lane.
