CURRENT GRANT FUNDING FOR TENTERFIELD SHIRE

"Last week, The Hon Adam Marshall MP paid a visit to Tenterfield to announce funding for the *Stronger Country Communities – Round 3* for: \$59,420 for shade cover over the playground at Rotary Park; \$43,789 for new public exercise equipment in a covered area near the footpath alongside the hockey fields; and \$68,418 for the installation of 2 new, synthetic turf, cricket practice nets at Shirley Park," said Mayor Peter Petty.

"In addition, Council has received in excess of \$1.4m for distribution in the community through the Federal Government's *National Bushfire Recovery Grant*. Community groups have been contacted and almost all the signed deeds have now been returned", the Mayor added.

"Some of the projects have commenced and will carry over into next year due to the COVID-19 restrictions. However, all of these projects will inject monies into the community and ensure Tenterfield is as ready as we can be once normal times resume", Mayor Petty added.

In closing, Mayor Petty sincerely thanked the Federal and State Governments for providing this funding.

"Projects have also been applied for under the *Bushfire Community Resilience and Economic Recovery Fund, Regional Tourism Bushfire Recovery Stream 2*, and *Drought Communities Program - Extension* to an amount nearing \$2m, however we are still awaiting approval and confirmation of these projects", Mayor Petty said.
