"I understand that there are members of our town under pressure at this time but this is a blight on our whole community. However, we will move on from here", Mayor Petty added.


The act of vandalism and graffiti has been reported to the Police for action.

# ACCESS TO COUNCIL FACILITIES – NO CHANGE TO COVID-19 SITUATION

Despite the fact that there is some slight easing of COVID-19 regulations, Council has reviewed the situation and determined that the environment hasn't changed dramatically since the closure of Council facilities on Thursday, 19 March 2020.

Council set a review date of 30 April 2020 and the decision has been taken to continue closure of Council facilities until further notice (possibly to early June 2020).

Facilities affected by the continued closure are:

- Administration Office
- Depot/Workshop

The majority of Council's staff are working from home as Council continues to provide the community with ongoing important services. A severely restricted number of staff continue to work in Council's Administration Building.

Water, waste, road/bridge maintenance, enhancement of parks and gardens, and Council governance continue to operate as normal with the introduction of soft plastic screens in vehicles to allow staff to travel together and audio/visual Council meetings allowing Councillors to attend to Council business.

"Our community has embraced the restrictions with few exceptions and this has allowed us all to remain safe and virus free", Mayor Peter Petty said.

"I understand how difficult it has been for business owners and I applaud those who have risen to the challenge and remained open through these trying times. I congratulate you all."

"I also understand the level of frustration that is starting to seep in but ask that everyone continue to respect our health workers, shop assistants and all those who are out and about continuing to keep our community together and readying it to bounce back when this awful time is over", the Mayor concluded.

## SEWER CCTV, CLEANING AND RELINING

Council's contractors Insituform, are currently in Tenterfield inspecting, cleaning and relining parts of the sewer network.

These important works ensure that the sewer operates normally and minimises the risk of sewer overflows. The inspection also helps inform Council's ongoing relining program.

Currently the crew are undertaking CCTV scanning of sewer lines and have completed 1km.

Relining works commenced 11 May 2020 and utilises cured-in-place technology. This involves winching the liner into the pipe followed by air inflation and steam curing. An installation machine inverts the liner upon itself while air pressure pushes it into position in the host pipe with steam curing of the liner in-situ.
