### COUNCIL FACILITIES TO OPEN WITH EASING OF COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS

With the easing of COVID-19 restrictions from **Monday, 1 June 2020**, Council will begin to open facilities to the community.

#### Customer Service

Council will operate a Customer Service Desk (window access only) from the Visitor Information Centre where community members can pay rates, etc.

The Customer Service Desk will operate from 9.00 am to 4.30 pm, Monday to Friday. Should you have an enquiry or wish to speak to members of the Planning or any other section of Council, please continue to call (02) 6736 6000.

Please note that the Administration Building remains **closed to the public** due to building works in progress.

#### Tenterfield Library

The Library will be opened for 2 x 2 hour sessions per day for members to renew/exchange books or access the public computers. This allows staff to clean equipment, etc to ensure the safety of all.

Times are 10.00 am to 12 noon and 2.00 pm to 4.00 pm – Monday to Friday and 10.00 am to 12 noon on Saturday. It is essential that you contact Library staff on 6736 6060 or email [tenpublic@tenterfield.nsw.gov.au](mailto:tenpublic@tenterfield.nsw.gov.au) to book computer time. High risk residents wishing to use the Library can do so between 9.00 am – 10.00 am, Monday to Friday by appointment only.

#### Visitor Information Centre

As visitors start to trickle back into Tenterfield, our Visitor Information Centre will be open to welcome them and provide the necessary help. Service available through window desk only, no access into the Centre.

Opening hours are 9.00 am to 4.30 pm, Monday to Friday with a decision on weekend opening hours still under consideration.

#### Sir Henry Parkes Memorial School of Arts Museum and Cinema

Unfortunately the Museum and Cinema will remain closed.

#### Council Depot

The Council Depot in Riley Street remains closed at this time pending review.

### NOTICE OF TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE Urbenville Road – Bridge over Unnamed Creek (located 650 metres from the intersection of Stephen Street and Boomi Street, Urbenville).

In accordance with Section 115 of the Roads Act 1993, notice is hereby given by Tenterfield Shire Council as the Roads Authority that the above road will be closed to all traffic on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> June 2020 from 8:00am to 4:00pm approximately eight (8) hours.

The temporary road closure is required to allow for Essential Energy to remove powerlines in conjunction with the bridge project.

### TRAVELLING STOCK RESERVES OFF LIMITS FOR FIREWOOD COLLECTION

With the cooler weather hitting NSW, Local Land Services is reminding people that it is illegal to collect firewood from Travelling Stock Reserves (TSRs).

Anyone caught removing timber or disturbing vegetation (alive or dead) from a TSR can be fined up to \$5,500 under the *Local Land Services Act 2013*.

These rules help protect the integrity of the network of Travelling Stock Reserves which is recognised as an asset of state significance with agricultural, social, cultural and ecological values. TSRs are an extremely important refuge for many rare and endangered native plants and fallen logs and standing dead wood can be part of their habitat. Decaying timber and leaf litter are also important in the process of nutrient recycling back into the soil.

Members of the public are asked to report any illegal activity to Local Land Services on 1300 795 299, or to contact NSW Police on 131 444.

While firewood collection is not permitted on TSRs, members of the public can apply for a permit to collect firewood from selected state forests.

## CURRENT GRANT FUNDING FOR TENTERFIELD SHIRE

"Last week, The Hon Adam Marshall MP paid a visit to Tenterfield to announce funding for the *Stronger Country Communities - Round 3* for: \$59,420 for shade cover over the playground at Rotary Park; \$43,789 for new public exercise equipment in a covered area near the footpath alongside the hockey fields; and \$68,418 for the installation of 2 new, synthetic turf, cricket practice nets at Shirley Park," said Mayor Peter Petty.

"In addition, Council has received in excess of \$1.4m for distribution in the community through the Federal Government's *National Bushfire Recovery Grant*. Community groups have been contacted and almost all the signed deeds have now been returned", the Mayor added.

"Some of the projects have commenced and will carry over into next year due to the COVID-19 restrictions. However, all of these projects will inject monies into the community and ensure Tenterfield is as ready as we can be once normal times resume", Mayor Petty added.

In closing, Mayor Petty sincerely thanked the Federal and Stae Governments for providing this funding.

"Projects have also been applied for under the *Bushfire Community Resilience and Economic Recovery Fund, Regional Tourism Bushfire Recovery Stream 2, and Drought Communities Program - Extension* to an amount nearing \$2m, however we are still awaiting approval and confirmation of these projects", Mayor Petty said.
