A Ward Councillor Peter Petty was re-elected Mayor for the ninth consecutive year at yesterday's Ordinary Council Meeting of the Tenterfield Shire Council.

Mayor Petty was the only nomination received for the position.

Councillor Greg Sauer was also re-elected, uncontested, for the position of Deputy Mayor, serving his third consecutive year, but fourth year as Deputy Mayor in the current Council term.

The current Council term was extended in March 2020 by amendment to the Local Government Act as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic with the next Local Government elections due 4 September 2021.

Mayor Petty referred to his position on the Local Health Committee and the continuing work of Council, and particularly Deputy Mayor Greg Sauer, in providing full support for our local health facilities and working with them to ensure the best possible services for our community.

In addition, Mayor Petty spoke about the growing industry of tourism in the Tenterfield Shire, and particularly the current interest in mountain biking.

Mayor Petty expressed his thanks to Deputy Mayor Greg Sauer for his ongoing support, Chief Executive Terry Dodds for his outstanding work to the benefit of all the Shire, and Executive Assistant & Media Noelene Hyde for her support during all his term as Mayor.

In closing, Mayor Petty voiced his pride that Councillors and staff are moving forward together to make this a wonderful, Shire wide, community.

#### FEDERAL MEMBER VISITS TENTERFIELD SHIRE

Member for New England, The Hon Barnaby Joyce MP paid a visit to Tenterfield Shire last week to view for himself the significant works that Tenterfield Shire Council staff have undertaken with Federal Government grant funding.

Firstly was an early morning stop on Mt Lindesay Road at Wylie Creek where he was met by a group of local tourism operators, who, while very appreciative of the ongoing upgrades to Mt Lindesay Road, expressed their distress at the impacts of the Queensland Border closure on their tourism businesses.

The 2.2 km section of Wylie Creek and 1.3 km Overcliffe/ Cullendore sections were sealed at a cost of \$860,000 through the Federal Government's Roads to Recovery program. A ribbon cutting event performed jointly by Mr Joyce and Tenterfield Mayor Peter Petty, declared the upgraded section officially open.

Mr Joyce then travelled down to Hootons Road to view the soon to be completed bridge over Emu Creek. Funded by Federal Roads to Recovery (\$382,000) and State Government Fixing Country Roads (\$1.82m) funding, Mountain Blue Blueberry farm also contributed \$70,000 to the new bridge to assist with access to their property.

While in the vicinity, Mr Joyce paid a flying visit to the construction site of the new Clarence River bridge on Hootons Road (works being undertaken by Kyogle Shire) and the very newly opened to traffic, Tabulam bridge.

A further ribbon cutting event took place at Plains Station Road to open the additional work following the upgrade to Frasers Cutting. Funded by Federal Roads to Recovery program at a total cost of \$680,000, this work has greatly improved the width and safety of the roadway.

"This has been a special opportunity for our Federal Member for New England, The Hon Barnaby Joyce MP, to visit and see the works that we have been powering through, and I express my sincere thanks to him for the road and bridge upgrades that are now in place, but also awaiting completion," said Mayor Peter Petty.

#### TENTERFIELD SHIRE COUNCIL KICKING GOALS ON BRIDGE REPLACEMENT, SEALING ROADS

I wish to congratulate Tenterfield Shire Council for replacing 23 of its local bridges during the past 19 months, with seven more bridges set to be replaced by Christmas. Tenterfield Shire Council has programmed to bitumen seal a further 43 kilometres of its unsealed or gravel road network by June 30, 2021.

If this combined works program was not impressive enough, the Council will be in the construction phase of its new Water Filtration Plant early in the New Year.

This level of activity, particularly during COVID-19, is a credit to Mayor Peter Petty, his fellow councillors, who set policy direction working as a team, and their can-do Chief Executive Terry Dodds.

Congratulations must go to key staff who make up the team on the ground – Fiona Keneally, Benjamin Mear, James Paynter, David Counsell, Gary Hirning, Clinton Airs, Ivan Foster, Nicholas Little, Joshua Lucas, Gary Back, Terry Stark, Kelly Pitkin and Neil Rhodes.

The funding stream split for the bridge replacement and road sealing work is: State Government programs 80 per cent; Federal Government programs 14.5 per cent; Tenterfield Shire Council 2 per cent and industry 0.5 per cent.

### NOTICE OF CHANGED TRAFFIC CONDITIONS Rouse Street, Tenterfield

In accordance with Section 115 of the Roads Act 1993, notice is hereby given by Tenterfield Shire Council as the Roads Authority that changed traffic conditions will apply to Rouse Street between Clifton and Miles Streets, Tenterfield for a period of up to 8 weeks commencing 28 September 2020 weather permitting.

The works are going to proceed in 100m blocks, with work on these sections typically occurring for 2 days. There will be no street parking available or access to the footpath on either side of the road in the 100m work site.

The changed conditions will allow for replacement of Council's ageing water mains infrastructure. This project is being run in conjunction with the TfNSW pavement rehabilitation project in the same area.
