THINKING ABOUT RUNNING IN THE 2021 COUNCIL ELECTIONS ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW

Ever thought about running for Council and having the opportunity to influence the future of Tenterfield Shire Local Government Area? All the information you need is available for you in one spot – Council's website - <https://www.tenterfield.nsw.gov.au/your-council/elections/local-elections>



A Councillor's role is important. The decisions a Council makes and the services it provides can change local communities and environments.

Council elections are normally held every 4 years but the current term has run from September 2016 to September 2021 due to the Minister for Local Government passing an amendment to the *Local Government Act 1993* postponing the election from 2020 to 2021 due to the COVID pandemic.

However, the new term from 2021 will still proceed to election in September 2024 making this a 3 year term.

Council has determined that the NSW Electoral Commission will conduct the elections to ensure that protocol, procedure, and transparency is maintained.

The Electoral Commission will appoint a Returning Officer who will be the point of contact for all enquiries regarding the election.

The Tenterfield Shire Local Government Area is divided into 5 Wards (A, B, C, D & E) with 2 Councillors elected for each Ward. Council elects the Mayor and Deputy Mayor from amongst the elected Councillors at the first meeting in September. Currently the Mayor holds a 2 year term with the Deputy Mayor being elected annually.

The *Local Government Act 1993* determines the number of Ordinary Council Meetings to be held annually, however Council, through its Code of Meeting Practice, can determine the time and date of these meetings.

Currently Ordinary Council Meetings are held on the 4th Wednesday of the month, commencing at 9.30 am but this can be amended by a resolution of Council to make changes to the Code of Meeting Practice. So the current day and time of these meetings can easily be changed if the majority of Councillors agree.

Candidate Nominations

To have your name included on a ballot paper you must be nominated as a candidate for the election and you must be enrolled to vote in the Local Government Area by **6pm on Monday, 26 July 2021**.

Nomination period commences **Monday, 26 July 2021 and ends 12 noon, Wednesday, 4 August 2021**.

Local Government elections across the State will be held on Saturday, 4 September 2021.

It is envisaged that Council, in collaboration with Local Government NSW, will conduct forums for interested candidates later in the year. Details for these will be widely advertised once arrangements have been finalised.

In the meantime, interested candidates are encouraged to visit the website regularly and familiarise themselves with all the available information as many legal obligations are involved.

Information will be updated on the website as new documents come to hand from either the NSW Electoral Commission or the Office of Local Government.

RESIGNATION OF CHIEF EXECUTIVE

On 15 December 2020 Mayor Peter Petty announced that "today I accepted the resignation of our Chief Executive, Mr Terry Dodds. Terry will be moving south to take up the position of Chief Executive Officer at the Murray River Council, commencing in the New Year. Terry took over the reins as our Chief Executive in October 2017 and has successfully led the Administration through an extremely challenging period."

"Terry managed the changes to not only the organisational structure, but more importantly linked the accountabilities of all the staff to the 4 Year Delivery Plan, which as of today's date sits at a remarkable 94% delivered".

"Council was in dire trouble with our timber bridge fleet, we'd endured a water crisis which required emergency bore installations, survived four bush fire emergencies, and contamination of our water supply from the soot and ash when it finally did rain, then COVID. Despite the curve balls, Council has achieved a wonderful level of delivery and service improvement in Terry's time here", Mayor Petty said.

"We've never built so many new bridges in such a short time, nor sealed so many kilometres of road. Tomorrow Council will review tenders for the replacement Water Filtration Plant, we now have EPA sign off for our new waste cell, and have completed a great many building alterations in less than two years. This hasn't been because we've employed twice as many people, it's because everyone is aligned to what they need to deliver as part of their individual contribution", The Mayor added.

The strategic planning that has been achieved behind the scenes will hold Tenterfield Shire in good stead for many, many years to come.

"Because I respect the man as an individual and respect the job he's done as our Chief Executive I've regrettably accepted his resignation and sincerely wish him and Fiona well in the future. Murray River Council's gain will be our loss", Mayor Petty concluded.

Council has appointed Chief Corporate Officer, Kylie Smith, as Acting Chief Executive from 11 January 2021 and will start the recruitment process for a new Chief Executive in the new year.

TENTERFIELD SHIRE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE NSW HEALTH SARS-CoV-2 SEWAGE SURVEILLANCE RESEARCH PROJECT

Tenterfield Shire Council has signed an agreement with NSW Health to participate in their SARS-CoV-2 Sewage Surveillance Research Project for the next 4 weeks and facilitate testing of sewage at both the Tenterfield and Urbenville Sewage Treatment plants.

"Given the detection of fragments of the SARS CoV-2 virus in sewage in Stanthorpe, Warwick and other parts of southern Queensland and the relative close proximity of these towns to the Tenterfield Shire, it seemed prudent to sample for the next 4 weeks" Council's then Acting Chief Executive Mr Paul Della said.

The testing can help provide early warning of COVID-19 infections in the community. These tests provide data to support NSW Health's response to the COVID-19 pandemic and further information on the project can be obtained by visiting <https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/Infectious/covid-19/Pages/sewage-surveillance.aspx>.

Mayor Peter Petty said that, "Regardless of the results of the sewage testing it is important to listen to the advice of the experts and continue to practice social distancing and most importantly get tested for COVID-19 if you experience even the mildest of symptoms".
