The proposed rates, fees and charges for 2021/2022 are outlined in the Draft Operational Plan which is now out for public consultation. Rates are proposed to increase by the rate peg imposed by the State Government of 2%; it is proposed that residential water consumption charges for next year not be increased (although business water consumption charges have been increased to equal the residential rate). The threshold for non-residential water consumption to move into the second tier price bracket has increased from 800 KI to 1,000 KI per annum.
