September 2021 Local Government Election Date of Saturday, 4 September 2021 is fast approaching.

All the information you need if you are considering running for election as a Tenterfield Shire Councillor is available for you in one spot – Council's website - <a href="https://www.tenterfield.nsw.gov.au/your-council/elections/local-elections">https://www.tenterfield.nsw.gov.au/your-council/elections/local-elections</a>

A Councillor's role is important. The decisions a Council makes and the services it provides can change local communities and environments.

Council elections are normally held every 4 years but the current term has run from September 2016 to September 2021 due to the Minister for Local Government passing an amendment to the *Local Government Act 1993* postponing the election from 2020 to 2021 due to the COVID pandemic.

However, the new term from 2021 will still proceed to election in September 2024 making this a 3 year term.

Council has determined that the NSW Electoral Commission will conduct the elections to ensure that protocol, procedure, and transparency is maintained.

The Electoral Commission will appoint a Returning Officer who will be the point of contact for all enquiries regarding the election.

The Tenterfield Shire Local Government Area is divided into 5 Wards (A, B, C, D & E) with 2 Councillors elected for each Ward. In the meantime, interested candidates are encouraged to visit the website regularly and familiarise themselves with all the available information as many legal obligations are involved.

# WORK BEGINS ON NEW WATER TREATMENT PLANT FOR TENTERFIELD

Work is underway on the new Tenterfield Water Treatment Plant thanks to \$7 million from the NSW Government, Minister for Water, Property and Housing Melinda Pavey announced today.

Mrs Pavey joined Tenterfield Shire Council Mayor, Peter Petty, to witness the start of work on the new plant, which will secure the supply of treated water for the town of over 4,000 people.

"Tenterfield's new water treatment plant is being made possible by \$7 million worth of funding, through the NSW Government's Safe and Secure Water Program," she said.

"Tenterfield is the northern gateway to New England and a growing tourist town so it's essential we work with council to provide the community with the increased confidence to continue developing.

"The current water treatment plant was constructed in 1930 and while updates have been made over the years, it's now time to replace the plant with a more modern, reliable system that can support the town's continued growth.

"While the recent rains have boosted local water supply across regional NSW, now is not the time to be complacent. We need to use the precious gift of time these rain events have given us to prepare and plan for the future, building the infrastructure and systems required to future-proof regional communities against drought."

Mayor Petty said the community is looking forward to the project progressing over the coming months.

"We're incredibly grateful to the government for this funding commitment which, allowed us to begin work on this vital infrastructure project for Tenterfield," he said.

"The new water treatment plant will deliver secure supply of safe drinking water to the community for long into the future and that provides reassurance to the people of Tenterfield."

The Commonwealth Government is co-funding the project by providing \$2.65 million.

The new water treatment plant is under construction adjacent to the existing plant and includes scope to allow for separate treatment of bore water if necessary.

Since it was established in 2017, the NSW Government's Safe and Secure Water Program has committed more than \$745 million to water infrastructure projects, and funding has been approved for 177 projects.

#### ONLINE PLANNING APPLICATIONS-MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS

The NSW Government has mandated that from 1 July 2021, all planning applications including Development Applications (DA's) and Complying Development Certificates (CDC's) will need to be electronically lodged online via the NSW Government Planning Portal.

The new process enables customers to lodge applications anytime using the online portal, paper applications will no longer be accepted.

#### **NSW MOUSE PLAGUE RESPONSE PROGRAM**

The NSW Government has announced a \$50 million support package to help landholders, households and small businesses tackle the ongoing impacts of mice across rural and regional NSW.

The Mouse Plaque Response Program includes:

- up to \$500 cash rebates for households and up to \$1,000 cash rebates for small businesses to cover the cost of baits
- free treatment of grain for use in perimeter treatment of broadacre cropping
- a multi-agency advisory committee to provide expert advice to Government
- research to identify a new mouse biological control agent for use in future plaques.

The NSW Government has lodged an application to the Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority (APVMA) for the use of bromadiolone in NSW.

- Local Land Services will operate the grain treatment stations.
- Service NSW will administer the Mouse Bait Rebate Program.
