**INAUGURAL BIKE RACE
EVENT TO SHOWCASE
TENTERFIELD'S GRANITE
TERRAIN AND BOOST LOCAL
VISITOR ECONOMY**



Tenterfield Shire Council is partnering with its local mountain bike club to take advantage of the emerging gravel cycling scene with a three-route race event taking place in August.

Gravel n Granite will take place on Saturday 21 August, 2021, catering for all levels of experience for participants aged 13 years and over, with three route options - 28km, 65km and 102km.

The event will be run by Tenterfield's Saddlers Mountain Bike Club and will cater for riders seeking a challenging adventure-based experience, taking them off the bitumen roads but without the higher level technical aspects of traditional mountain bike events. Not to be outdone, traditional mountain bikers are also attracted to these events, presenting an opportunity to challenge road riders on their own terrain.

Chris Thompson of *cyclesense=excellence* has worked with the club to prepare an event management plan, ensuring a professional and experienced approach is applied to planning and implementation.

"Cycling NSW has identified the potential of this new type of 'hybrid' event and has extended its traditional focus from road and track cycling to include a gravel event on its calendar for the first time," he said.

"The region's scenic, challenging gravel roads interspersed with quiet bitumen sections presents potential to attract a wide-range of participants from around the country".

Thanks to government grant funding received as a result of the region being hit hard by bushfires, it is intended that *Gravel n Granite* will generate enough momentum and attendees to become a highlight of Tenterfield's annual event calendar, attracting hundreds of participants from near and far and providing a boost to the local visitor economy.

Mayor Peter Petty said Council supports the future of gravel cycling and mountain biking in the region, following a business case presented by Regional Development Australia - Northern Inland in October

STAY OUT OF HARM THIS WINTER

Devastatingly around 20 people die in home fires each year. Winter is a critical time for fire prevention and education due to the spike in home fires, fire-related deaths and injuries.

During winter Fire and Rescue NSW attends more than 1000 home fires – this is roughly one third of reported home fires annually.

Winter also makes up half of all reported fire-related injuries, with around 200 injuries.

Fire and Rescue NSW is dedicated to reducing these numbers to zero through their Safety Visits and educational programs. But what can you do to help stay out of harm?

- Check you have a working smoke alarm. Use a broom to click the test button of your smoke alarm, if you do not hear an alarm sound, you will need to replace the battery or replace the alarm.
- Create an Home Fire Escape Plan and practise it with those in your home.
- Keep looking when cooking
- Don't overload power boards
- Keep everything a metre from the heater
- Never use wheat bags to warm your bed
- Check electric blankets for frayed cords and other damage
- Don't use outdoor heating and cooking equipment inside the home as it can be fatal

Most importantly, if a fire does occur, get out, stay out and call Triple Zero (000).
