### **Citizen of the Year – Peter Harris**

He has also been selected as a member of the New England Zone Basketball Team and the North West Region Open Boys Basketball Team competing at the NSW CHS Basketball in Tamworth.

Isaac has been selected as a member of the Western Mustangs Under 18 Rugby League team to play in the 2021 Mal Meninga Cup, Warwick Cowboys Under 18 team, New England Zone Open Boys Rugby League Team and the Tenterfield Bumblebees.

Isaac is a great example of sportsmanship, leadership and dedication to his teammates and community, and encapsulates the spirit of Young Sportsperson of the Year.

**Emergency Services Volunteer of the Year, or Group, Award – Valarie Flint** Valarie has been an active member of the Legume Rural Fire Service for close to 30 years and is the current President.

For more than 50 years Valarie has been the 'go-to' person for first aid or community welfare issues and for the last 14 years has been a Killarney first responder for the QAS covering the northern Tenterfield Shire.

Valerie was Secretary of the Legume School P&C Association until the school closed and has been Secretary of the Legume Progress Association since 1993.

Valerie also performed community welfare checks on residents who are aged or living alone during COVID, ensuring they had the support needed to access vaccinations and services during isolating periods.

Valerie gives tirelessly of herself day and night to help the community. Be it a bushfire, vehicle accident, aiding someone sick, injured or dying, helping an expectant mother or any other situation that calls for assistance, support, reassurance, first aid or simply a friendly ear, Valerie will be there.

#### **Community Event of the Year – Tenterfield Autumn Festival**

The inaugural Tenterfield Autumn Festival was held over the 4 day long Easter Long Weekend and was a huge success for the town.
