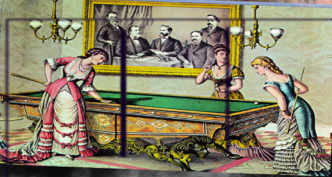

WATER & SEWERAGE ACCOUNTS NOW OVERDUE

Water & Sewerage Notices were due for payment on 1 February 2022. Multiple reminder notices have been issued by post and hand delivered notices will be scheduled for delivery on 8 March 2022 to applicable properties.

If full payment of water & sewerage accounts have not been made or a satisfactory arrangement entered into, Council will install a water flow limiter. Limiter installations are scheduled for Tuesday 22 March 2022.

Additional fees will be incurred if a water limiter is installed.

RATES & CHARGES THIRD INSTALMENT DUE FOR PAYMENT

Council wishes to advise Residents and Business Owners that the Third Rates Instalment Notices are now due for payment on 28 February 2022.

Ratepayers are reminded that interest accrues on all overdue rates, service charges and water & sewerage consumption charges on a daily basis at a rate of 6% per annum.

NOTICE OF DISRUPTION TO TRAFFIC

Gravel & Granite Cycling Event, Tenterfield

In accordance with Section 115 of the Roads Act 1993, notice is hereby given by Tenterfield Shire Council as a roads authority that there will be disruptions to all traffic on the following roads on Saturday 12 March 2022 between 6am & 5pm to allow for the Gravel & Granite Cycling Event to take place which could see up to 500 competitors.

The event will commence at the Showgrounds in Manners St and will utilise Miles St, Douglas St, Western St, Mt McKenzie Rd, Kildare Rd, Sunnyside Loop Rd, Bruxner Way, Woodside Rd, Gunyah Rd, Gibraltar Rd, Mole River, Upper Mole River Rd & Railway Ave.

The courses are Short (29km), Medium (65km) & Long (102km) and can be viewed at www.thesaddlersmtbclub.com.au

Motorists are requested to pay particular attention to the advance warning signposting and detours erected on these roads and obey the directions of any on-site traffic controllers. Speed zone reductions will be in place during the event.

Ballandean Street, Manor Street & Duke Streets, Jennings

In accordance with Section 115 of the Roads Act 1993, notice is hereby given by Tenterfield Shire Council as the Roads Authority that there will be disruptions to traffic on the abovementioned roads commencing Tuesday 1 March 2022 for a period of up to four (4) weeks, weather permitting.

The temporary road disruptions are required for a private contractor to relocate and construct a new private water pipeline in the Ballandean Street, Manor Street and Duke Street road reserves. Works will be undertaken between 7:00 am and 6:00pm Monday to Friday, 8:00am to 1:00pm Saturday.

The works will involve Contractors utilising plant and machinery.

Motorists are requested to pay particular attention to the advance warning signposting and obey the directions of any on-site traffic controllers.
