On Wednesday 23 March 2022 at the Ordinary Council Meeting, Tenterfield Shire Council resolved to a temporary change to the normal operating hours of the Tenterfield Public Library. The normal operating hours for the main library branch of Tenterfield Public Library will be 10.00am to 5.00 pm Monday to Friday and closed weekends.

The decision to amend the normal operating hours across library services is based on a long-term reduced use of the services during the amended periods and in an effort to improve efficiencies across the organization as part of wider budgetary reviews.

The continuation of library services of the Torrington branch of Tenterfield Public Library is also currently under review and will be closed until further notice.

#### LOCAL HERITAGE PLACES FUND 2022-23

#### **APPLICATIONS OPEN**

A Local Heritage Places Fund has been established by Tenterfield Shire Council with partially matching funds from the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage. The aim of the fund is to encourage as much positive work on heritage items in the area as possible. The fund will enable applicants to undertake sympathetic repairs to their properties which are consistent with generally accepted heritage principles. Replacing like with like, repainting properties in their original colours, using recycled or traditional materials where possible and undertaking research on the history of a property before undertaking repairs are key ideas which are encouraged by the program.

The Local Heritage Fund funds projects:

- for conservation and maintenance works
- to meet National Construction Code upgrades (fire, services, and access) for ongoing and new uses
- for heritage items and items in conservation areas in the Tenterfield Local Environmental Plan 2013.

This year Council is calling for applications from across the Shire, with submissions closing on 29 July 2022. # RURAL ROAD MARKER REPLACEMENT PROJECT

Tenterfield Shire Council has recently secured funding from the Australian Federal Government under the Black Summer Bushfire Recovery Grant to replace rural address markers that have been destroyed during bushfires and to allocate a rural address and number marker to properties who may not have previously applied.

Rural address markers are a simple but effective means of locating and identifying properties in rural areas, especially in the case of an emergency. They ensure that emergency services such as the RFS, SES, or Ambulance can find your property quickly and efficiently. It also allows for easy identification of a property during essential services connection and provides more efficient delivery services.

Over the coming months, Tenterfield Shire Council will be contacting eligible landowners to discuss the replacement of damaged markers and the allocation of new rural addressing to properties that may not have previously applied. Installation of the markers will be undertaken free of charge by Council staff across the Shire, between September 2022 – February 2023.

Ratepayers are reminded that interest accrues on all overdue Water & Sewerage Notices and Rates and Charges Notices on a daily basis at a rate of 6.0% per annum.

Please complete the checklist before submitting your completed application to Council with a copy of the front and back of your Pensioner Concession Card.

## You may be eligible for the rebate if ...

- You have a current Pensioner Concession Card, and
- The property is your primary place of residence, and an Occupation Certificate has been issued.

# WEED OF THE MONTH

Common Name: Sticky nightshade

Botanical Name: Solanum sisymbriifolium

How does this weed affect you? Sticky nightshade is an invasive plant that:

- competes with crops and pastures
- prevents native plants from growing

• has sharp prickles which can injure people, pets, livestock and native animals

• can make harvesting difficult (for example in vineyards).



**Poisoning:** Sticky nightshade contains steroidal glycoalkaloids toxins. It is suspected to have caused cattle deaths in the Greater Sydney Region.

What does it look like? Sticky nightshade is an erect plant to 1.5 m high. Most of the plant is hairy and covered in very sharp prickles. It is an annual or short-lived perennial. Multiple, severe frosts may kill the above ground parts of the plant but it will reshoot from rhizomes in spring. It can flower within 5 weeks of germination or regrowth from rhizomes. Flowering is usually during spring and summer.

Where is it found? Sticky nightshade is mostly found in Western Sydney and the Central Tablelands. However, it has also been found in the Central West, South East, Hunter, Midnorth Coast and Riverina. It is native to South America.

# What type of environment does it grow in? Sticky

nightshade grows in full sun and semi shade. It can grow in a wide variety of soil types and environments including:

- in pastures
- on cultivated land
- along waterways
- along roadsides

• on steep rocky slopes.

It grows best in moist soil conditions.
