## ADDRESSING THE POTHOLE ISSUE

With the recent extended period of wet weather, residents are requested to take caution when using the council road network. Continued wet weather is making conditions and any long term repairs challenging.

The road network is saturated and wet weather accelerates the deterioration to Council's road network. Potholes can appear overnight and road surfaces, both gravel and bitumen are breaking up even with any short term repairs that Council has undertaken.

Staff are currently attending to in excess of 3,000 defects, including potholes and pavement failures across the network as soon as they are able and while Council is committed to providing all weather access to residents on unsealed roads, there is a need for all motorists to take care and drive to the conditions.

All available resources are allocated to ensure our road network can return to a safe and useable condition as soon as practical. When you see our outdoor teams out filling the potholes in the rain or effecting repairs as fast as they can, please be mindful that Council is aware that the treatment can often be a quick and temporary fix but it's all that we can do at the moment under the current conditions.

Council is asking residents to report any dangerous pot holes, washed away roads or damage to infrastructure that needs to be addressed, by phoning Council on 02 6736 6001. Council is experiencing a high volume of customer requests and we ask residents to be understanding of the situation as there are many roads affected by this adverse weather and it will take time to address all damage.

Council deals with road defects on a prioritised, risk assessed and systematic basis.

## TENTERFIELD WASTE NEWS—PLASTICS BANS

To reduce the effects of plastics on the environment and in generated waste streams that end up in landfill, the NSW EPA and State government have introduced a new waste strategy designed to reduce the amounts of waste generated by business and the general public <https://www.dpie.nsw.gov.au/our-work/environment-energy-and-science/waste-and-sustainable-materials-strategy> Currently the average waste generated per person is approximately 2.1 Tons per year! The measures to eliminate plastics are expected to reduce waste generation by 10%.

New Legislation has come into force from 1<sup>st</sup> June 2022 from the NSW Government, under the **Plastic Reduction and Circular Economy Act 2021**, online at <https://legislation.nsw.gov.au/view/html/inforce/current/act-2021-031> banning the use of light weight plastic bags below 35 microns! This includes recyclable or compostable plastic bags as treatments are required to make them compostable. You may have noticed the re-usable bags in Coles and Woolworths which are currently acceptable, as they are above the 35 micron limit, bin-liners, dog and nappy waste bags, green waste bin caddies and produce or deli bags are still Ok for use. Please note these items are **not** recyclable!

Future legislation which will come into force on the 1<sup>st</sup> November 2022 under the legislation **Plastic Reduction and Circular Economy Act 2021**, will be the banning of single use plastics, with a full list available online at [Single-use plastics ban in NSW | NSW Dept of Planning and Environment and Plastics \(nsw.gov.au\)](https://www.dpie.nsw.gov.au/our-work/environment-energy-and-science/plastics-action-plan/phasing-out-single-use-plastics-in-nsw). Additionally the bans apply to retailers, manufactures, distributors and any activity for charitable, sporting, education or Community purposes see <https://www.dpie.nsw.gov.au/our-work/environment-energy-and-science/plastics-action-plan/phasing-out-single-use-plastics-in-nsw>

Excess stock for single use plastics and lightweight plastic bags can be sent to the Great Plastic Rescue (see website [Great Plastic Rescue](https://www.greatplasticrescue.com.au))



It is expected that the new and future legislation will be enforced by the NSW EPA and associated fines may apply.
