HISTORIC KOREELAH CREEK BRIDGE RESTORED

A rare example of a pre-World War 2 concrete arch road bridge has received some much needed love and care with maintenance work now complete.

Minister for Regional Transport and Roads, Sam Farraway said the project was jointly funded with technical experts brought in to help conduct the repairs. "Work to preserve this iconic structure included scaffolding the entire bridge for access and then repairing 91 concrete patches and 84 large cracks," Mr Farraway said.

"We also removed graffiti, painted the entire structure with a clear anti-carbonation coating, repaired bridge deck joints as well as removed and replaced the deck bitumen spray seal."

Mr Farraway said the 91-year-old Koreelah Creek Bridge had recently undergone preservation work to ensure the longevity of the historic structure.

"Built in 1931, the Koreelah Creek Bridge has great historical significance to the region," Mr Farraway said. "Not only did John Bradfield, the man who later designed the Sydney Harbour Bridge, design this iconic concrete structure, it is also the second oldest concrete arch bridge that is still in use in our state.

"The bridge is more than 68 metres long which is why it was important that we did what we could to preserve this bridge, so it can be enjoyed for another 91 years." Work included targeted maintenance to address the cracking and concrete cancer plaquing the bridge structure.

The project is part of a \$24 million program funded by the Australian and NSW Governments Mount improve Lindesay Road, with much of the road work carried out by Tenterfield Shire Council.

NEW CONTAMINATED RECYCLING BIN POLICY

Tenterfield Shire Council has recently undertaken an audit of recycling bins in Tenterfield, to assist the community in recycling correctly.

Collection and processing of recycling is a legislative requirement for Council under the Waste Avoidance and Resource Recovery (WARR) Act 2001. To deliver recycling to the community is a costly exercise, with transport of collected materials costing \$15,000 each month. This figure is increased if contamination is discovered at the Polytrade facility where the recycling is processed. Contaminated loads are disposed of by landfilling (or contaminated landfill if containing asbestos). These costs of disposal range from \$300 to \$600 per ton, adding an additional burden for Tenterfield Shire residents.

To address the issues of contamination the New Contaminated Recycling Bin Policy (currently under community consultation) provides a way for council to address repeated misuse of recycling bins. Please view the policy online at https:// www.tenterfield.nsw.gov.au/
