Welcome to our final issue for 2022!



As we prepare for the Christmas break, I join my fellow Councillors in thanking Shire residents for their resilience in dealing with the environmental and economic challenges of the past year. Your understanding during this challenging time is very much appreciated, and I take this opportunity to reassure ratepayers that your Council is determined to provide all our communities with cost-effective services of the highest standard.

While it has been pleasing to see damaged road infrastructure repairs being effected as weather conditions allow, Councillors recently voted unanimously to join Local Government NSW and the NSW Country Mayors' Association in declaring a state-wide "road emergency" to seek a boost in State and Federal funding to fix our roads. We are already looking forward to upgrades on four of our ageing timber bridges, thanks to funding by the NSW Government's Fixing Country Bridges Program, as well as additional pothole funding being announced.

Concerns about the bat colony in Millbrook Park are increasing and a representative of the Department of Planning and Environment will visit Tenterfield early next year to investigate and advise Council.

Meanwhile construction on the Tenterfield Youth Precinct and Mountain Bike Trailhead is a step closer with the contract for a Design and Construct tender now awarded. We also finish 2022 on a high note with the announcement of funding for many of the Community Events we treasure (see Page 3 of this newsletter). A feature article on Tenterfield (partially funded by Council) in Regional Lifestyle magazine's Summer edition showcased the attractions and appeal that make Tenterfield Shire a great place to live in or visit.

RATES AND FINANCE

Council continues to improve its percentage of outstanding rates and charges. As of 30 June 2022, outstanding percentage was 4.01% compared to 4.41% in the previous financial year ending 30 June 2021 (for comparison, the benchmark for rural councils is 10%)

This has been due to the management and administration of Early Intervention Visits for our ratepayers to significantly decrease the additional cost in legal fees and build better relationships to support our community during the difficult times we faced over past few years with natural disasters and COVID -19.

Council has processed 310 x Section 603 certificates to 1/12/2022 (2022 calendar year) compared to 435 x Section 603 certificates to 2/12/2021 (2021 calendar year). Continued high volume of Section 603 certificates for 2022 is still having a flow on effect with increased amount of change of ownership, pensioner applications and creation of new assessments due to properties being subdivided and split for rating purposes.

Special Rate Variation

On 7 December 2022 Council resolved to apply to Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) to increase its revenue from rates income by 43% (including rate peg) for financial year commencing 2023-24 and a further 43% (including rate peg) for financial year commencing 2024-25, representing a cumulative increase of 104.49%. The final determination will be provided by IPART in May 2023.

Council's hardworking Waste Staff bounced back from Covid restrictions and border closures at the start of 2022 to in Waste. Water achieve a very productive year.

Recycling shops opened in Liston, Torrington, Drake and Tenterfield with a high level of patronage by the public.

A new EPA grant awarded to Council to assist in Bushfire recovery provided fencing, site offices and communications for Boonoo Boonoo landfill site, with a weighbridge soon to be installed.

The waste team completed their first recycling audit, leading to the development of a recycling policy to aid staff in reducing contamination in the Shire's recycling bins.

Ensuring water security for the Shire into the future, our Water team had their Integrated Plan Management Catchment approved and were excited to see the new Water Filtration Plant construction pass the at Urbenville completed. 50% completed mark.

WATER AND SEWER CONTINUED:

An upgraded flood warning system provided under a grant from the Department of Planning Environment has been completed and is now functional; information is available on-line at dataonline.io

The Urbenville Woodenbong flood study was completed. Additional grants have been received for Tenterfield to expand current floodmapping and to upgrade the Urbenville water supply plus undertake the village bore program. Works will begin in January 2023.

Replacement of Clive street major main completed with works underway to replace the major water main to East Street reservoir.

Sewer works included:

- repairs to 8 major mains, repair of 62 connections, installation of 32 new water meters and repair/replace of 30
- repairs to 77 service blockages/repairs iiand installation of 15 new sewer boundary shafts:
- all manholes in Tenterfield were inspected, assessed, and rated for condition with 200 individual GPS positions added to Councils' mapping system;
- to aid infiltration a smoke testing program identified 69 faults and 3 illegal connections:
- 1.9km of sewer mains relined and over 3.9km of mains inspected, cleaned and close circuit camera inspected;
- planning works commenced to Molesworth bridge redesign the aqueduct and construction of the new sewer main extension to the new filtration plant;
- sludge ponds cleaned at Tenterfield with Urbenville rescheduled due to flooding;
- replacement of the major pump station
