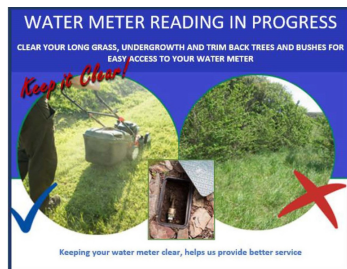

WATER METER READING

Water meter reads will commence during May & June 2023 for approximately 4 weeks. In order to help Council staff it would be appreciated if property owners could:-

- Trim back/remove shrubbery or trees that are obstructing water meters.
- Contact Council Staff if you have locked gates and organise a time for meter to be read
- Contact Council staff if you have dog/s that need to be restrained.



Winter is approaching - please make sure your meter is covered.

Water & Sewerage Notices will be issued at the end of June 2023 with payment of accounts due 1 August 2023.

- ◆ Trim bushes & trees that block access or cover the meter
- ◆ Don't bury or mulch over your meter
- ◆ Remove any objects (flower boxes, garbage cans, equipment) that blocks access
- ◆ Keep pets away from the meter
- ◆ Ensure meter is not blocked by fencing or locked gates
- ◆ Clearly display your home's address on your residence

RATES & CHARGES

FOURTH INSTALMENT NOTICE 2022/2023

Council wishes to advise Residents and Business Owners that the Fourth Rates Instalment Notices were issued at the end of April 2023. These will be due for payment on or before 31 May 2023.

Ratepayers are reminded that interest accrues on all overdue Water & Sewerage Notices and Rates and Charges Notices on a daily basis at a rate of 6.0% per annum.

FUNDING TO RESTORE WAR MEMORIALS

The Member for Lismore, Janelle Saffin, says local communities who need to maintain or repair their war memorials can apply for funding in the latest round of the Community War Memorials Fund for 2023-2024.

"The latest funding round opened on Anzac Day, a time when we gather at our local war memorials to honour those who serve in wars and peacekeeping missions."

Community groups can apply for up to \$10,000 to assist with conservation, specialist cleaning and repairs of local memorials including honour rolls.

For example, in the previous round Richmond Valley Council was awarded \$10,000 for conservation work to two First World War honour rolls at the Woodburn Memorial Hall which suffered damaged in the 2022 flood.

To be eligible for funding, the memorial must be listed on the NSW War Memorials Register. Applications close on 25 July 2023. Details at www.veterans.nsw.gov.au

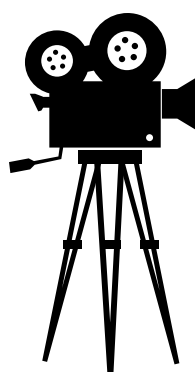

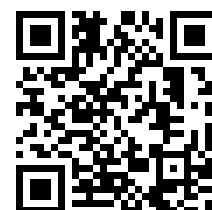
