





2024 KILLARNEY P-10 STATE SCHOOL P&C BORDER RANGES TRAIL RIDE

The Killarney P-10 State School Parents and Citizens Association will be running a motorcycle trail ride on Saturday and Sunday the 23rd & 24th March 2024. This event will be known as the Killarney P-10 State School P&C Border Ranges Trail Bike Ride and as per previous years, is being organized by a Sub-committee of the Killarney P-10 State School P&C Association.

This will be the events 23rd year.

This is a non-competitive event.

This event will only proceed if weather and tracks are dry. .

The event will consist of Trail Bikes of various sizes and capacities, both registered and unregistered and with licensed and unlicensed riders, also of varying ages. This year, the route will begin in Queensland and cross into NSW on both days.

Riders have the option of nominating for one of three tracks – Open Track, Novice Track or the Peewee Track. The Open Track runs different tracks on the Saturday and Sunday. Saturday's is approximately 35-40km in length and Sundays is approximately 50-65km. The exact distance is not known till end September when all the tracks have been marked out. The Novice Track is the same for Saturday and Sunday and is approximately 14km long.

The Peewee Track is a track that is in the Killarney Showgrounds Main Show Ring.

The route for the 2024 event has again been determined by the property owners who have generously donated the use of their land for the event.

This event will be capped at 800 Open Riders, 200 Novice Riders and unlimited Peewee Riders.

This event brings many people into the Killarney area and is a major event on the community calendar. It benefits not only the school but also local businesses and community organizations.

In 2024 this event raised funds for the Killarney P-10 State School, Killarney Recreation Club, Killarney Show Society, Legume Rural Fire Brigade and Tannymorel Hall Committee. Many local businesses also benefit from the event.

The Killarney P-10 State School Border Ranges Trail Ride committee have a facebook page which is used to communicate information to the general public – Killarney P-10 State School P&C Border Ranges Trail Bike Ride.

This is monitored to ensure everything that is posted is appropriate.

Rider's Briefing and Camp Rules are emailed to everyone who has nominated.

The event has full insurance with Marsh Insurance, which is the Insurance provider for the Queensland Council of Parents and Citizens Association.

The committee will receive a copy of the 2024 Insurance policy in early/mid March. This will be forwarded to relevant authorities as soon as it is received.

The 2024 nomination and indemnity form will be updated with any changes requested by the insurance company in March. A copy of our proposed 2024 nomination and indemnity form is attached. (See Appendix A) All landholders are listed as interested parties on our Certificate of Currency. Signed approval is sought from landholders to use their property.

Southern Downs Regional Council, Killarney Police, Warwick Ambulance, Warwick Hospital, SES, Killarney Rural Fire Brigade, Legume Rural Fire Brigade, Killarney Fire Brigade, Killarney First Responders, TMR, Tenterfield Shire Council and NSW Police are all to be notified of the event. Please see Appendix K for details of letter.

It is compulsory for all participating riders to complete the 'Nomination and Indemnity Form' in full.

In the event that the participant is under the age of 18 years a parent or legal guardian is to complete and sign the form. All nominated riders are to be issued with a wristband (which is placed on their wrist at the nomination table) and a helmet sticker. The number on the wristband and helmet sticker must correspond with the registered number on their nomination form. The wristband and helmet sticker also state what track (Open, Novice or Peewee) the nominated person can ride on. There are different coloured wristbands for each track.

Riders can only nominate to ride on one track. Novice Parent Helmet Sticker- can be given to a parent (who has paid as an open rider) wanting to check on a Novice Rider on the novice track. They must stay with that novice rider at all times while riding the novice track.

Volunteers manning the nominations table will also ensure that any rider who is banned does not register to ride.

Qld Ambulance will also be based at the Killarney Recreation Hall on both days with a fully equipped ambulance. They will be assisted by Killarney First Responders (if available).

1300 Medics will also be stationed out on the track. They are generally stationed at the fuel stop or a road crossing depending on the track route and where is deemed most suitable for them.

Members of the Killarney First Responders (if available) are stationed out on the Novice track on Saturday and Sunday. The football field and the golf course at the Killarney Recreation Club will be fenced off and will be the designated area for Lifeflight to land, should they be required.

Interstate riders are advised to have their own ambulance cover.

Riders are advised to bring their own first aid kit for minor injuries such as those which just require a bandaid.

All Medical staff and security staff are briefed prior to the commencement of the event.

A list of emergency contact phone numbers is available to all Medical Staff, security, volunteers/marshals and sweeps. This list is to include phone numbers for Events Manager, Emergency contact number for riders to use, Killarney Police, President, Trail Boss, Security, recovery vehicle drivers and other volunteers whom the committee deem necessary.

The Legume Rural Fire Brigade are also on site on the Sunday. They will be based at the fuel stop during the day. The Killarney Rural Fire Brigade will be at the camp grounds in the morning to ensure that all fuel drums meet safety requirements before they are transported out to the fuel stop.

The Killarney Recreation Club and Killarney Show Society run the canteen/bar for the weekend.

All sponsors and stall holders are required to sign the 'Incoming School Sponsorship Offer' form.

All stall holders must be approved by the committee prior to the event and comply with all regulations that the committee impose. All stallholders must have their own insurance and a copy of their Certificate of Currency must be provided. All stalls are set up near the Killarney Recreation Hall.

Preference is given to locals organizations where possible.

Riders are permitted to camp at the Killarney Show Grounds and the Killarney Recreational Grounds free of charge. Security is present on the Friday and Saturday nights to ensure a safe environment for the campers.

Additional toilets and showers are hired (if required) for the weekend along with extra skip bins.

All nominated riders will receive a copy of the camp rules. These rules will also be posted on the facebook page and flyers.

The general public are not permitted to be out on the track.

Sweep riders will be circulating around the open and novice tracks. They are easily identified by their bright pink shirts. The Trail Boss is to ensure there are an appropriate number of sweep riders.

Sweep riders are briefed prior to the track opening.

Recovery vehicles are used to recover any broken down bikes. The sweep riders will organize to get the bikes to an accessible point near the track for collection and return to the camp site.

A fuel stop is included in the Sunday loop.

Riders are to leave their fuel in a suitable marked container at the designated point at the recreation grounds on Sunday morning where they are transported out to the fuel stop. These containers are then returned at the conclusion of the ride. When possible, containers that have been placed in the early returns crate are also returned during the day. Shuttles of water are situated at the fuel stop for riders to replenish their drink containers. Rural Fire Brigades are stationed at the fuel stop and help co-ordinate proceedings.

Saturday night entertainment consists of a FMX show and a band. The raffle is also drawn during the evening. A bar will also be operating. All regulations regarding the Responsible Service of Alcohol must be adhered to. Security is employed in the bar area.

If the ride is cancelled or postponed the facebook page and school website will be updated as soon as possible after the decision has been made.

If the ride is cancelled during the weekend announcements will be made at the event.

Nomination fee refunds will be processed through the booking agent.

INJURY TO RIDERS

RISK

Riders may become injured while riding.

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

Riders are to sign the indemnity form stating that they attend or participate at their own risk. See Appendix A. This is a copy of the proposed form. The 2024 form will not be available until mid March.

Riders must wear protective clothing including boots, helmet, and goggles.

Riders must ensure their motorcycles are in good working order.

Riders are reminded at the riders briefing that this is not a race and to stay on the marked track as they do not know what is hidden in the grass beside the track.

While riding, all riders must be courteous and respectful to all other trail users and marshals/volunteers. They must follow directions given by marshals and volunteers at all times.

Danger signs are placed in areas where extra caution is required. These are a white square with a red X on it.

Sweep riders are out on the track to assist riders.

Riders are all given the emergency contact phone number to call in the case of an injury or emergency. Riders are advised at Riders Briefing what to do in the case of injury. Riders are encouraged to have an app on their phone that gives GPS co-ordinates.

Casualty Evacuation Plan (see Appendix B) is to be followed if required

Track is not to be opened until Ambulance and Medical Staff are ready and Trail Boss is satisfied that all sweeps are in place and gates, fences have been opened and track ready to go.

Fully equipped ambulance and medical staff are to be based at the Killarney Recreation Hall.

On Saturday and Sunday, 1300 Medics are to be positioned out on the track at a point determined by the organizers – generally either at the fuel stop or a road crossing.

Members of the Killarney First Responders (if available) are to be stationed out on the Novice Track on Saturday and Sunday.

Area to be taped off at Killarney Recreation Hall for helicopter landing if needed.

A register of details of reported injuries must be kept.

Riders are not allowed to be under the influence or consume alcohol or drugs during the event as stated on facebook page and flyers. RBT's to be conducted when possible.

RIDERS MAY GET LOST

RISK

Riders may get lost

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

Riders are instructed to always follow the arrows, tape and signs marking the course.

Sweep riders are to ensure that riders follow the track.

Riders are given the emergency phone number to call if they are lost or in difficulty.

ILLEGAL RIDING ON ROADS

RISK

Unregistered motorcycles riding on the road Riding a motorcycle when they are unlicensed due to court or other action Riders are over the BAC limit or under the influence of drugs

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND ACTION TO BE TAKEN

Riders are warned that they must not ride unregistered motorcycles on public roads regardless of whether the road is closed or not. Police will be booking any offenders in accordance with the law. This is mentioned in the riders briefing, on the facebook page and flyers.

Riders can't participate in the event if they are unlicensed due to court action or other action. They are advised of this on facebook and flyers. Each rider signs an indemnity form which states in it 'Due to road closure provisions, riders are not permitted to participate in the Event if they currently have a drivers' licence that has been cancelled, suspended or disqualified.'

Riders may be alcohol/drug tested at any time while on the track. They are advised of this in the riders briefing, the facebook page and flyers. If police resources permit RBT's are carried out at the start gate on both Saturday and Sunday – anyone over the limit is charged in accordance with the law. If police resources permit, riders will have the opportunity to test themselves before the ride commences on Sunday.

ROAD CROSSINGS

RISK

Riders/Marshals may get hit by motorists

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

Riders are advised that they must not ride on any public road, regardless of whether the road is open or closed. This reminder is given at riders briefing, on the facebook page and on flyers.

All riders must give way to motorists. At all times priority is given to motoring public. No vehicles on the roadway will be inconvenienced.

The approaches to the road crossing will be taped to a small entry point to allow for effective control of the motorcycles by the event marshals.

Riders must stop at the Stop Sign placed on the track at the road boundary, turn off their motorcycle, dismount from their motorcycle and wait for directions from Event Marshalls. Motorcycles must be pushed across the roadway to the other boundary and then they may remount and continue riding.

Signs warning of traffic hazard ahead will be placed 400m and 50m on the roadway edge prior to crossing point and reduce speed sign at 200m on roadway edge prior to crossing point, or as per our permit requirement See appendix D

There will be a minimum of 3 marshals at each crossing.

All marshals will be qualified with an Event Traffic Management Marshal Certificate.

All marshals are required to wear a compliant orange fluorescent safety vest as an outer garment at all times when conducting assigned traffic control duties. When undertaking these duties the vest velcro must be fastened. The vest must comply with Class F in Australian Standards AS/NZS 1906.4.2010 retroreflective materials and the design and placement of retroreflective strips must be class R or RF in Australian Standard AS/NZS 4602:1999 High visibility safety garments.

EMERGENCY VEHICLES CAUSING INJURY TO RIDERS WHILE ON THE TRACK

RISK

Riders may be injured by emergency vehicles which on the track attending to an emergency

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

Riders are advised at riders briefing, on the facebook page and on flyers that they must provide a clear path for emergency vehicles.

Emergency vehicles must have their lights flashing and if required sound their siren.

DEHYDRATION

RISK

Riders may become dehydrated

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

Riders are advised to take water/fluids with them at riders briefing, on facebook page and on flyers.

Water to be available at Fuel Stop on Sunday's track

RIDERS NOT HAVING A WRIST BAND & HELMET STICKER

RISK

Riders who have not nominated entering the track iders can't be easily identified in the case of injury. Banned riders nominating to ride

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

All riders must have their wrist bands and helmet stickers checked when entering the start gate.

Riders are required to push their bikes through the start gate to make identification easier. Portable gate panels and tape will be used at the start gate to form a funnel to allow nominated riders to only pass through one at a time. Wristbands are placed on the riders arm by the person taking their nomination and each rider is given a helmet sticker with the same rider number on it as the wristband. These can't be interchanged between people.

In the event of a rider losing their wristband or sticker they must report to the nominations hall for a replacement. The rider number is also recorded on their nomination form and will be used in the case of an emergency to identify the rider and obtain their information.

All volunteers on the nomination table have a list of the banned riders and they must not accept the nomination form or issue a wristband or helmet sticker

RIDERS TRY TO RIDE WRONG TRACK



Riders attempt to ride on the wrong track.

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

Wristband and Helmet stickers are easily identifiable for different tracks (colour and design will be different for Open, Novice and Peewee Track).

These will be checked when riders pass through the start gate. Riders must push their bikes through the start gate to allow for easy identification by marshals.

RIDERS TRY TO LODGE INSURANCE CLAIMS AGAINST THE ORGANIZERS, VOLUNTEERS OR LANDHOLDERS

RISK

Participants try to lodge claims against the organizers, volunteers or landholders

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

All participants sign an indemnity stating to release the Killarney P-10 State School Parents and Citizens Association, Killarney Recreation Club, Killarney Show & Rodeo Society, promoters, sponsor organisations, land owners and lessees, organisers of this Event, their respective servants, officials, representatives and agents (collectively the "Associated Entities") from all liability for my death, personal injury (including burns), psychological trauma, loss or damage (including property damage) (harm) howsoever arising from my participation in or attendance at the Event except to the extent prohibited by law'.

All volunteers must nominate as volunteers of the P&C Association to be covered under their insurance policy. All landholders are listed as interested parties on our certificate of currency.

INJURY CAUSED BY UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOUR IN THE CAMP SITE

RISK

People attending the event could be injured by unacceptable behaviour in the camp site

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

Security Officers are employed to patrol the camp sites. They have the authority to remove wrist bands from offenders. These offenders will not be permitted to ride once their wrist band has been removed. Offenders may also be banned from further events. Serious offences will be referred to the police.

Noise curfews are to be enforced.

Fires are banned.

Fireworks are banned.

Glass is banned.

Riding is not permitted in camp area other than to go to or come from the start gate during the event.

INJURY CAUSED BY FIRE IN CAMPING AREA

RISK

People attending the event may be injured from fire Property may be damaged from fire

Property may be damaged from me

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

All fires are banned. This is stated on the facebook page and on flyers.

Security officers are to enforce this rule.

Il riders are given the emergency phone number for the headquarters at Killarney Recreation Hall to call in the event of a fire.

Riders are to follow directions given by Fire Bridge, Police, Sweeps and other marshals/volunteers.

INJURY CAUSED BY DOGS

RISK

People attending the event could be injured by dogs

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

Dogs are banned from the event as stated on our facebook page and flyers.

INJURY CAUSED BY GLASS

RISK

People attending the event could be injured by glass

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

Glass is banned from the event as stated on our facebook page and flyers.

RIDERS GEAR MAY BE STOLEN/DAMAGED

RISK

People attending the ride may have belongings stolen or damaged

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

Riders are reminded on the facebook page and on flyers that their machine is a valuable investment and to ensure that their bike and equipment are securely stored at all times.

Security is present in the campsite on Friday and Saturday nights.

FIRE OUT ON THE TRACK

RISK

Fire caused from combination of fuel and sparks

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

The Rural Fire Brigade will be in attendance at the fuel stop.

All riders must follow their instructions at all times as mentioned in the Riders Briefing and flyers.

Fuel drums must comply with safety standards. The Rural Fire Brigade will be checking these and any unsuitable containers will not be permitted.

Fuel containers are to be held in a separate fenced area. Riders are to walk into this area, collect their container, refuel their bike and return the container to the designated area. Bikes are to be turned off when refuelling.

Smoking is not permitted out on the track.

Riders are given the emergency phone number to contact authorities at Killarney Recreation Hall in the event of a fire out on the track.

BIOSECURITY

RISK

Contamination of land from foreign articles (eg. rubbish)

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

All bikes must be clean before entering track.

Riders to be advised of this in the riders briefing, on facebook page and on flyers.

Gate marshals will not allow bikes that are not clean out on the track.

Track markers to ensure that track doesn't pass through any areas of infestation.

Riders are not to leave any rubbish on the track. Rubbish bags are provided at the Sunday fuel stop.

Tear offs are banned as per mention on the facebook page and flyers.

COVID-19 AND OTHER INFECTIOUS DISEASES

The committee is to implement protocols that Qld Health requires in the event of an outbreak.

Inappropriate behaviour of patrons Alcohol entering or leaving premises Underage drinking

MEASURES TO CONTROL RISK AND GUIDELINES TO BE FOLLOWED

Security will be present while bar is open.

Alcohol is not permitted to be bought into or leave the bar area. Security will police this. A fence will be erected around the bar area with entry/exit points manned by security.


